

Privacy Policy



A Nation of Hope understands the importance of safeguarding our clients' and partners' personal and proprietary information. We are committed to upholding the standards set forth in this policy.

1. Privacy Policy

- A Nation of Hope ("us", "we", or "our") operates using the domain, anationofhope.org.
- This document is to inform you of our policies regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of personal data when you share information on the Website, anationofhope.org (or on any other affiliate partner platforms for products and/or services).
- The legal basis for collecting and using the personal data described in this Privacy Policy depends on the personal information we collect and the specific context in which we collect it. We may process personal data because (1) we need to perform a contract with you, (2) you have given us permission, (3) the processing is in our legitimate interests, or (4) we need to comply with legal obligations.
- Unless otherwise defined in this Privacy Policy, terms used in this Privacy Policy have the same meanings as in our Terms and Conditions, accessible from the Website, anationofhope.org.
- This Policy governs all of the web pages on the Website and does not apply nor govern other affiliate websites or third party sources.

2. Information Collection and Use

We collect different types of information for multiple purposes to provide services and improve the performance of the Website.

3. Types of Data Collected

- Personal Data
 - On the Website, we may ask for specific personally identifiable information (PII) that can be used to contact or identify you ("Personal Data"). Personally identifiable information (PII) may include, but is not limited to:
 - Full Name
 - Physical Address
 - Mailing Address
 - Email Address
 - Cookies & Usage Data

4. Usage Data

- We may collect information on how the Website is accessed and used ("Usage Data"). This Usage Data may include information such as your computer's Internet Protocol address (e.g. IP address), browser type, browser version, the pages of our website that you visit, the time and date of your visit, the time spent on those pages, unique device identifiers and other diagnostic data.

5. Tracking & Cookies Data

- We use cookies and similar tracking technologies to track the activity on our website and hold certain information.
- Cookies are files with a small amount of data which may include an anonymous unique identifier. Cookies are sent to your browser from a website and stored on your device. Tracking technologies also used are beacons, tags, and scripts to collect and track information and to improve and analyze the Website.
- We use both essential and non-essential cookies. By continuing to use our Website, you consent to the use of essential cookies. You may choose to opt-in to non-essential cookies, such as those used for analytics or marketing, through a cookie banner that allows you to manage your preferences.

6. Helpful Information About Cookies

- We may use cookies for a variety of reasons (such as for sessions, preferences, security, and trusted third parties). It is recommended that you leave on all cookies if you are not sure whether you need them or not in case they are used to provide a service that you use. These cookies may track things such as how long you spend on the site and the pages that you visit so we can continue to produce engaging content.  - We also use social media buttons and/or plugins on this site that allow you to connect with your social network in various ways. For this to work, these social media buttons will set cookies through our Website which may be used to enhance your profile on their site or contribute to the data they hold for various purposes outlined in their respective privacy policies.

7. Disabling Cookies

- As noted above, you can prevent the use of cookies by adjusting the settings on your web browser (see your browser Help feature for more information). It is recommended that you do not disable cookies.

8. Use of Data

- A Nation of Hope will use the collected information for various purposes, such as:
 - To provide and maintain the website
 - To notify you about changes to our website
 - To allow you to participate in interactive features of our website when you choose to do so
 - To provide customer care and support
 - To provide analysis or valuable information so that we can improve the website
 - To monitor the usage of the website
 - To detect, prevent and address technical issues
 - Transfer of Data
- Your information, including Personal Data, may be transferred to — and maintained on — computers located outside of your state, province, country or other governmental jurisdiction where the data protection laws may differ from those from your jurisdiction.
- If you are located outside Texas and choose to provide information to us, please note that we transfer the data, including Personal Data, to Texas and process it within that jurisdiction. We may share your personal data with third-party service providers who assist in operating the website, such as hosting providers, analytics services (e.g., Google Analytics), and payment processors. These providers are contractually obligated to maintain the confidentiality and security of your information and are only permitted to use your personal data in accordance with our instructions.
- Your consent to this Privacy Policy followed by your submission of such information represents your agreement to that transfer.
- A Nation of Hope will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Policy, General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCI DSS) compliance, and any other applicable law. No transfer of your Personal Data will take place to an organization or a country unless there are adequate controls in place including the security of your data and other personal information.

9. Users' Data Rights

11. Security Of Data

- We may partner or employ third party companies and individuals to facilitate our Service ("Service Providers"), to provide the Website on our behalf, to perform website-related services or to assist us in analyzing how the Website is used.
- These third parties have access to your Personal Data only to perform these tasks on our behalf and are obligated not to disclose or use it for any other purpose.

- We have no control over and assume no responsibility for the content, privacy policies or practices of any third party websites or services.
